What do I need to apply?

- A photo of yourself that is 2 inches square
- A copy of your valid Illinois State ID, Illinois driver's license, or Chicago CityKey card
- Enrolled in BAP or last RTA card was a Ride Free Permit

What is BAP?

The Benefit Access Program (BAP) is an income-based program offered through the Illinois Department of Aging for people 16 years and over with a disability or older adults over 65.

Reduced Fare

What do I need to apply?

- A color photo of yourself that is 2 inches square
- A copy of your State ID, driver's license, Chicago CityKey card, US Passport, or Consular ID
- Proof of disability or over the age of 65

Access Pilot

What do I need to apply?

- A photo of yourself that is 2 inches square
- Must live within the RTA region – Cook, DuPage, McHenry, Lake, Will, and Kane counties
- A copy of your SNAP decision notice letter dated within one year
- Valid ID (state ID, driver's license, Chicago CityKey card) with an address that matches your SNAP eligibility letter

What is SNAP?

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides food benefits to families experiencing low incomes.
